Will review it and update it every year. We just had a successful lock down drill<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Maslah: The statistics of crime is updated - happy to point out that crime has reduced by 27%; otherwise no new updates on the plan</li><li>Austin-Singer: It's difficult to discern emergency bell rings from another</li><li>Abdi: We are aware of this problem and are working on putting direct communication in place via a central communication system</li><li>Ismail: Perhaps having designated people who are responsible to notify others during emergencies</li><li>Abdi: We are working on this</li></ul></li><li>Abdi: LCAP - Annual budget was passed this year. Increased funding for school site that should be recognized now. It wasn't recognized initially in the LCAP. Shortage of staffing and not having enough teachers has been a challenge. We will be able to add additional adds to staff and increase substitute pool, increase engagement with families to explore solutions to problems<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Austin-Singer: We had a reading specialist in the beginning of the year but is no longer here. Will there be money allocated toward a reading specialist?</li><li>Abdi: Dr will help in this area and will provide resources to teachers</li><li>Abdi: Supplement will include additional resources such as a school counselor to provide more support to students who need it</li><li>Maslah: We also have a full time school psychologist</li></ul></li><li>Austin-Singer: I am happy that GLAD is coming. It will be an awesome addition to the toolkit.<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Abdi: This will help our ELD students, in which most fall under.</li></ul></li><li>Maslah and Abdi: Have a 9a meeting. Will depart.</li><li>Allison: I have a concern about the abrupt pause of the after school program. There was no plan initially, but teachers eventually organized students and a plan and progress was being made. Progress cannot be made without consistency. Teachers were not asked for their input on pausing the program. The program is changing again.<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Austin-Singer: Consistency is a concern in other areas too. Progress was being made with the reading program, but now I'm covering half of the day and cannot meet with students regularly. Also, data is being affected because of inconsistency of the program</li><li>Ismail: Consistency is key. Otherwise, students will not feel supported.</li></ul></li><li>Austin-Singer: I have been seeing bullying in classrooms, and specifically with one student who other students are calling gay but is also a behavior student, so not sure what can be done about it</li><li>End at 920a</li></ul>
