Notes:  Start: 9:18a <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Community Outreach/Marketing Planning<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Abdi: Utilized various outreach methods to connect with families and recruit more students including direct mail, MTS ad, KPBS and NPR and other media outreach<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Austin-Singer: We have a large influx of newcomers this year. Are we reaching out to those communities?<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Abdi: Yes; also looking to help with transportation for communities that are interested in attending Iftin</li><li>Franco: A sister school might be beneficial, closer to East County<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Abdi: Yes, that's an idea to explore</li></ul></li></ul></li><li>Abdi: Focus this year is media outreach, enhance Iftin branding and retain current students</li><li>Abdi: We have annual events that we hold including a picnic and marketing campaigns<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Public events are important; we are able to engage with new families</li><li>We have outreach stations at different community events</li><li>Year after year, we see an average increase of 7%</li></ul></li></ul></li><li>2023-23 Iftin Budget<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Abdi: Budgeting for 470 students; 55 more students that the current school year<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Average daily attendance (ADA) for 2022-23: 386</li><li>ADA for 2023-24 - estimating 410</li><li>Governor proposed a 50% cut on learning recovery program; deficit 94k 2023-24; looking for other resources</li><li>Will allocate 100k toward arts and music</li><li>Austin-Singer: Will there be a science lab?<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Abdi: For 7 and 8th grades, looking to implement NGSS lab</li></ul></li><li>Austin-Singer: With projected ADA increase, will room be made to accommodate influx of students?<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Abdi: We are looking for ideas</li></ul></li><li>Franco: What does 1 million cut include?<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Abdi: Includes shortening classified positions. Unless we find funding to sustain current staffing</li></ul></li><li>Franco: No increase in certificated salary<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Abdi: Budget is a rough draft and we expect budget to go up, according to CBA</li></ul></li></ul></li><li>Summer School Planning<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Abdi: 18 days, 5 hours per day; currently have 160 students enrolled; accepting all students; will keep groups small 1:10 teacher to student; more instructional aides available; Dr Sciorba will join us in effort;</li><li>pre and post assessments; looking into Renaissance Star Reading and Star Math because assessment is short and will get immediate feedback; piloting program with no cost to Iftin</li><li>Budgeted 160,000 for summer program; includes all departments including curriculum and materials (admin, certificated, classified, sped, speech and carnival to close program)</li><li>Austin-Singer: Could we offer a blended program during summer to pilot where students are grouped by academic level (or based on Star results), versus by grades so that intervention can take place; no TK for summer</li><li>Fadumo: Can we add extra curricular activities such as cooking, sewing, etc.?</li></ul></li></ul></li></ul></li></ul>		

- Abdi: That's a great idea, but time is limited for these activities during the summer. But for after school, next school year, we can add extra curricular activities
- Allison: Maybe one day of the week, instead of PE, students can have a choice to do an extra curricular activity, other than PE
  - Fadumo: Some girls do not want to do PE every day
  - Abdi: Will advocate options other than PE
